Copper Service Award

As part of the service learning component for the CHHS Emphasis Program, we would like to recognize those students who are extending themselves outside of the school curriculum and into the community. Those students who would like to receive the Copper Service Award for their volunteer work must complete the following:

- Volunteer for a minimum of 100 hours throughout their high school years (10, 11, 12).
- Submit documentation of the service hours earned. *(To include activities, dates of service, hours spent and signature/title of person verifying service.)*
- *Service required for a grade, paid service hours and court ordered service hours will not be counted towards the Copper Service Award.*
- *A scout may count his personal Eagle hours towards the Copper Service Award but may not count the entire troops hours.*

Recognition through the Copper Service Award

1. The student will receive a Copper Service Enhanced Diploma.
2. The student will wear a Gold Cord on their graduation robe. *(Students who qualify for the Copper Service Award will be required to pay a \$5.00 fee at the time they pick up their cap and gowns. Students who do not have the required fee on the day that caps and gowns are given out will need to go to Jostens to pick up their cord. Students who do not want to keep the honor cord after graduation ceremonies can return the cord directly to Jostens and have their \$5.00 reimbursed.)*
3. The student will be acknowledged on the graduation program for earning the Copper Service award.
4. The student's transcripts will reflect the Cooper Service Award.
5. The student will be recognized at the Senior Awards Reception.
6. The student will be awarded a Copper Service Pride Pin.
